- Optimizing the Risk-Based Inspection Plan (RBIP)

What does this mean for you?



- More consistent licensing and inspection program
- More frequent compliance verification via inspection (e.g. coverage of remote sites)





Regulatory Review

Regulatory Review launched in spring 2021 to modernize the Explosives Regulatory Regime

Primary Lens: GoC Modernization Agenda

- The right requirements to achieve safety & security mandate
- Eliminate unnecessary admin & regulatory burden
- Performance-based so adaptable to change
- Relevant and future-ready

To modernize the Explosives Regulations, 2013

To enhance how the Explosives Program delivers its safety and security mandate and responds to the needs of stakeholders

To foster and proactively maintain a world-class Canadian explosives regime





Regulatory Plan

Bring forward two consecutive omnibus regulatory amendment packages

1. Amendments Package #1: Economic Growth and Enhancing Safety

- Improve efficiency by reducing admin burden, aligning with partners, clarifying intent
- Address safety and security risks

2. Amendments Package #2: Program Modernization

- Update licensing and fee regimes
- Explore new requirements and innovation







Status of Amendments Package #1

Current Status

- Stakeholder consultations held
- Drafting Instructions developed
- Finalizing Impact Assessment

Next Steps

- Drafting! Goal is to finalize drafting early in New Year
- CGI <u>April 2023</u>
- Adjustments and prep for implementation between Gazettes
- CGII October 2023



Status of Amendments Package #2

Current Status

- Policy development to identify amendments and rationale
 - Authorizations
 - Licences, Permits, Certificates
 - Underground manufacturing
 - 'Less Than Truckloads' (LTL)
 - Fees
 - Restricted Components
 - Rocket Motors

Next Steps

- Finalize policy recommendations
- Stakeholder consultation in New Year
- Ultimate goal is CGI in spring 2024, CGII fall 2024

Of Note...

- Some complex issues removed to meet timelines, and added to future Reg plan e.g.
 - Tracking high hazard explosives
 - Equivalent level of safety
 - Destruction of expired explosives and explosives packaging

Amendments Package #2 and CEAEC

1. Align with the global standard that Unsensitised Bulk Emulsions are classified as UN3375 and not UN0332

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2 to clarify the regulation of UN3375

2. Change the licence renewal period to two or thee years

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2

3. Remove import/export permits for companies and add authority to valid licences

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2. However, a separate import/export permit is still required to allow CBSA to release a shipment across the border, to allow unlicensed entities to import/export, and to track single shipments that may be transported to several different sites

4. NRCan's MPU licensing should focus on process and not on CMVSS components

This is something we could work towards in the future, but does not need regulatory change to realize

5. Combine Division 1 and 2 manufacturing licences

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2. However, wouldn't this disadvantage small manufacturers, and create unnecessary burden for some low risk manufacturing activities.





Amendments Package #2 and CEAEC

6. Have MPUs be a Division 3 manufacturing process

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2. However, should an MPU be a Division 1 licence?

7. Remove requirement for Division 1 application to include site topography Amendments being explored as part of Package #2

- 8. Add a quantified risk assessment as an 'equivalent level of safety', as an alternative to meeting QD To be explored in a future amendments package
- 9. Remove requirement to keep lists of PPE for Division 1

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2

10. Expand list of activities conducted underground to include transferring pumping/transfer from an IBC into a process unit and storage of bulk explosives, and use of underground equipment on the surface of the mine site

Amendments Package #2 and CEAEC

And from what we heard at the CEAEC AGMs:

- Industry would like us to explore the tracking of high hazard explosives
 To be explored in a future amendments package
- 2. Industry would like a definition of a mining operation or surface blasting vis-à-vis the provinces Being explored through review of QD standard
- 3. Industry would like better access to shared licences

Amendments being explored as part of Package #2





Key Issues – Transport of UN3375 in Canada

- CEAEC members who wish to transport UN3375 in Canada under TC's *Equivalency Certificate SH13715* need to seek a Notice of Authorization from NRCan
 - CEAEC members would need to submit a new application through the eLMS containing all required information detailed in the Regulations, as well as Test Series 8 results, if available
 - The technical data would be reviewed and any relevant testing performed by CERL
 - A Notice of Authorization would be issued, to confirm compliance with Special Provision 309 (SP309), detailed in the UN Model Regulations
- Ammonium Nitrate Emulsions, Suspensions or Gels (ANEs) to be considered:
 - Type E.1
 - PE1
 - Not Class 1 for transport, but confirmed to comply with SP309
- ANEs to be regulated under the Explosives Regulations, 2013 the same as UN0332
